



Columbine Flower

Special Stitches:

5-Single Crochet Popcorn (5SCP). Work 5 SC in designated place. Remove hook from stitch and insert in first of the 5 SC's. Grab thread and pull through loop on hook to make popcorn.

For each columbine you will need four colors of thread. The centers are always yellow; the rest of the petals are up to you! In nature, columbines come in virtually every color of the rainbow.

Center -

With Yellow, chain 5, join with sl st to form ring.

Round 1/ Work 10 SC in ring, join with sl st to first SC.

Round 2/ *Ch 3, skip one SC, SC in next SC. Repeat from * around, join with sl st to first stitch. Fasten off.
Attach Color 1 in any CH 3 loop.

Round 3/ CH 1, *Work 5SCP in loop, CH 3, sl st in next ch 3 loop. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 3, sl st in back of first 5SCP.

Round 4/ *CH 4, sl st in back of next 5SCP. Repeat from * around ending with ch 4, sl st in back of first 5SCP.
Fasten off.
Attach Color 2 in any CH 4 space.

Round 5/ *CH 2, work 7 DC in ch 4 space. CH 2, SC in same space. Sl St in next CH 4 space. Repeat from * around, ending with sl st in base of first ch 2.

Round 6/ *CH 5, sl st in base of first stitch of next petal. Repeat from * around ending with ch 5, sl st in base of first ch 2. Fasten off.
Attach Color 3 in any ch 5 space.

Round 7/ Ch 1, work SC, DC, 2 TRC and DTR in same ch 5 space; CH 4, SC in first ch of CH 4 just made; work DTR, 2 TRC, DC and SC in same space. Sl st in next ch 5 space. Fasten off.

NOTE - Optional Edging: As shown in the photo of the three columbines, I will often do a SC edging row around each petal in the first set of petals. It adds more definition, I think. Sl st at right bottom of petal, SC in each stitch working 2 SC's on each corner. Sl at left bottom of petal.

Crochet Flower Pattern Pretty 3 layer Crochet Flower Pattern

I love to crochet flowers, they are so easy to make. Crochet flowers are a delight to crochet and once you have the hang of a basic flower shape the list is endless to the pretty flower appliques you can make to finish off your projects.

Hook 4.00mm

ch 5, join round with sl st.

Round 1. ch1, 10 sc in the loop, join with the beginning sc with a sl st.

Round 2: ch1, sc in the same stitch, *ch 3, skip the next stitch, sc in the next st., *repeat until you have 5(3 chain spaces)

slip into 1st 3 chain loop, work in these for this round

Round 3 *ch 1, 6 dc in the chain space 3, ch 1, slip into next chain 3 *repeat until you have 5 petals, sl st.

Second layer of flower



(Pull chain loop to back of work and work this round behind 1st round of petals)



Round 4: *bpsc, ch 5, bpsc, ch 5, *repeat until you have 5(5 chain spaces) sl st in beg stitch. **(Pic left)**



Round5 *ch 1, 9 dc in the chain 5 space, ch 1, sl st. in the previous sc, *repeat until you have 5 petals sl st to finish.



3rd layer of flower

(Pull chain loop to back of work and work this round behind 2nd round of petals)



Round6 { *bpsc, ch 5, bpsc, ch 5, * }repeat until you have 5(5 chain spaces) sl st in beg stitch.

Round7: *ch 1, 9 triple crochet in the chain 5 space, ch 1, sl st. in the previous sc, *repeat until you have 5(9 triple crochet pedals) sl st to finish, fasten off and weave in the ends

Crochet Flower Pattern (Easy 3D Crochet Flower) | Free Crochet Patterns



Crochet Flowers are a wonderful way to brighten up any of your crochet projects. I could sit crocheting flowers all day, and have a great collection of different crochet flower patterns, always something to suit my projects.

I thought I would share one of my favorite flower appliqué patterns with you.

A simple 2 layer crochet flower pattern, For the more advanced I have included the extra rnds to make into a 3 layer crochet flower.

for the one in the intro picture I used a 4.00mm Hook and Thick Double knit yarn. For the step by step photos below I used 3.00mm (UK) and Baby double knit yarn (the beauty of crocheting flowers once you have made one the simplicity of the pattern, means try using larger smaller hooks and thick or thinner yarn.

These crochet flowers are fantastic to use to accent and finish off your projects, following the pattern with whatever size hook and Yarn you wish.

FLOWER

Ch 4, join with sl st to form a ring.

Rnd 1 Ch 5, *sc in ring, ch 3* do this 6 times. Join with sl st to 2nd ch of beg ch. Place marker for beg of rnd. Slip marker each rnd.

Rnd 2 *{Sc, hdc, 3 dc, hdc, sc} in next ch-3 sp, rep from * 6 times. Join with sl st to beg sc.

Rnd 3 1Sc around the back post of previous SC of Rnd 2, { ch 6, * sc around the back post of next Rnd2 SC, rep this step 6 times in total.. Join with sl st to beg sc.

You will now have 6 chains around the back of flower to make the next layer petals.

Rnd 4 *{Sc, hdc, 5 dc, hdc, sc} in next ch-6 sp, rep from *A TOTAL of 6 times 6 petals created
Join with sl st to beg sc.

(you now have a 2 layered flower)

Advanced:

To make more rounds of petals - continue working around the back post of

Rnd 5 Sc through back of sc of Rnd 4, ch 6, * sk next sc, sc through back of next sc of Rnd 4, ch 6, rep from * 5 times. Join with sl st to beg sc.

Rnd 6 Repeat Round 4. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

How to crochet a flower in Photos!



Ch 4, join with sl st to form a ring.

Rnd 1 Ch 5, *sc in ring, ch 3* do this 6 times. Join with sl st to 2nd ch of beg ch. Place marker for beg of rnd. Slip marker each rnd.

Rnd 2 *{Sc, hdc, 3 dc, hdc, sc} in next ch-3 sp, rep from * 6 times. Join with sl st to beg sc.



Rnd 3 1Sc around the back post of previous SC of Rnd 2, { ch 6, * sc around the back post of next Rnd2 SC, rep this step 6 times in total.. Join with sl st to beg sc. You will now have 6 chains around the back of flower to make the next layer petals.



Rnd 4 *{Sc, hdc, 5 dc, hdc, sc} in next ch-6 sp, rep from *A TOTAL of 6 times 6 petals created
Join with sl st to beg sc.

(you now have a 2 layered flower)

You now know how to crochet around the back post of the previous round single crochet to make the next layers petals. to make the flower bigger with more layers just repeat Rnd 3 and Rnd 4.

Free crochet Flower pattern



5 Petal 3d flower

Step 1: Make 5 ch and join with sl st to form ring.

Step 2: 10 sc in center of ring.

Step 3: sl st to top of first sc.

Step 4: create a petal in the first sc - sc, 3dc, sc

Step 5: continue creating small petals in every other sc using the same pattern - five petals in total. sl st to join with first sc of first petal.

Step 6: turn to the back of the flower, sc down through base opening of small petal.

Step 7: ch 3, and sc through next petal base opening.

Step 8: repeat 4 more times in each opening. sl st through first sc, creating a series of 5 loops total.

Step 9: create a large petal in the first loop - sc, 5dc, sc

Step 10: continue creating a large petal in each of the remaining 4 loops. sl st to join with first sc of first petal.

Carnation



Skill Level: Easy

Supplies: Size 10 cotton crochet thread; size B/1/2.25mm crochet hook, (or size 3 steel crochet hook for smaller size flower)

This pattern can also be completed using size 20 cotton crochet thread using a size 6 or size 10 steel crochet hook.

Stitches Used: slst (slip stitch), ch (chain), sc (single crochet), dc (double crochet).

Directions:

Rnd. 1: ch6, join with slst to form ring.

Rnd. 2: ch1, 7sc, ch2, 7sc, ch2, 7sc, ch2 in ring; join with slst to beginning sc. 21 sc

Rnd. 3: ch4, dc in same st; *dc, ch1, dc in next sc*, repeat from *to* 19 times (skip over ch-2 spaces); join with slst to 3rd ch of beginning ch 4.

Rnd. 4: slst to ch-1 sp; sc, ch3 in same sp; *sc, ch3 in next ch-1sp*, repeat from *to* around, join with slst to beginning sc; fasten off.

Rnd. 5: attach thread in ch-2sp on rnd. 2; working behind first row of petals, ch1, sc, ch5 in same sp; *sc, ch5 in next ch-2sp*, repeat from *to* once; join with slst to beginning sc. 3 ch-5 loops

Rnd. 6: ch1, sc in same st, 10sc in ch-5 loop; *sc in next sc, 10sc in next ch-5 loop*; repeat from *to* once; join with slst to beginning sc. 33 sc

Rnd. 7: ch4, dc, ch1 in same st; *dc, ch1, dc in next sc*; repeat from *to* around; join with slst to 3rd ch of beginning ch 4.

Rnd. 8: slst to ch-1sp, ch1, sc, ch3 in same sp; *sc, ch3 in next ch-1sp*; repeat from *to* around; join with slst to beginning sc; fasten off.

Chrysanthemum

Here's the latest flower to bring in spring a little early.



Skill Level: Easy

Supplies: Size 10 cotton crochet thread; size B/1/2.25 crochet hook, (or size 3 steel crochet hook for smaller size flower)

This pattern can also be completed using size 20 cotton crochet thread using a size 6 or size 10 steel crochet hook.

Stitches Used: slst (slip stitch), ch (chain), sc (single crochet), dc (double crochet).

Directions:

Rnd. 1: ch6; join with slst to form ring; ch1; work 12 sc in ring; join with slst to beginning sc. 12 sc

Rnd. 2: ch1, sc, ch10, sc in same st; *sc, ch10, sc in next sc*; repeat from *to* 10 times; join with slst to beginning sc. 12 ch-10 loops

Rnd. 3: *slst to ch-10 loop; ch3, 19dc in loop, sc in next sc*; repeat from *to* 11 times; join to beginning slst; fasten off for single row of petals; continue to rnd. 4 for double row of petals. 12 petals

Rnd. 4: working behind first row of petals, ch1, sc, ch1 in same st; *sc, ch1 in next sc*; repeat from *to* 10 times; join with slst to beginning sc.

Rnd. 5: ch1, sc, ch10, sc in same st, slst in ch-1sp; *sc, ch10, sc in next sc, slst in next ch-1 sp*; repeat from *to* 10 times; join with slst to beginning sc. 12 ch-10 loops

Rnd. 6: *skipping over next slst; slst to ch-10 loop; ch3, 19dc in loop, sc in next sc*; repeat 11 times; join; fasten off. 12 petals

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Black Eye Susan



Skill Level: Easy

Supplies: Size 10 black and yellow cotton crochet thread; size B/1/2.25mm crochet hook, (or size 3 steel crochet hook for smaller size flower)

This pattern can also be completed using size 20 cotton crochet thread using a size 6 or size 10 steel crochet hook.

Stitches used: ch (chain), slst (slip stitch), sc (single crochet), hdc (half double crochet), dc (double crochet)

Directions:

Rnd. 1: with black; ch2; work 8 sc in 2nd ch from hook; join with slst to beginning sc. 8sc

Rnd. 2: ch1, *2sc in next sc*; repeat from *to* 7 times, join with slst to beginning sc; fasten off black. 16sc

Rnd. 3: with yellow; attach thread at any sc with slst; *ch10, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in next 5 ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch, slst in next sc on black center*, repeat from *to* 15 times; join with slst to beginning slst. Fasten off for single petal row flower, for double row, continue to rnd. 4. 16petals

Rnd. 4: ch1, sc, ch1 in same st, working behind first row of petals; *sc, ch1 over next slst (into sc of previous rnd.)*; repeat from *to* 14 times; join with slst to beginning sc.

Rnd. 5: *ch10, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch; dc in next 5 ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch, slst in ch-1sp, slst in next sc*; repeat from *to* 15 times; fasten off. 16 petals

Note: additional rows of petals can be added by repeating rnds. 4 and 5.

Rose and Small Rose



Skill Level: Easy

Supplies: Size 10 cotton crochet thread; size B/1/2.25mm crochet hook, (or size 3 steel crochet hook for smaller size flower)

This pattern can also be completed using size 20 cotton crochet thread using a size 6 or size 10 steel crochet hook.

Stitches Used: slst (slip stitch), ch (chain), sc (single crochet), dc (double crochet).

Gauge will vary depending on size of hook and thread.

Directions-Small Rose:

Rnd. 1: ch16, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across; ch3, turn. 15 sc

Rnd. 2: dc in same st; *2dc in next sc*; repeat from *to* 13 times; ch3, turn. 30 dc

Rnd. 3: dc in same st; *2dc in next dc*; repeat from *to* 28 times; ch3, turn. 60 dc

Rnd. 4: dc in same st, skip next dc, *sc, ch2, dc in next dc, skip next dc*; repeat from *to* across; fasten off.

Stem:

Rnd. 1: ch2, 6sc in 2nd ch from hook, join with slst to beginning sc. 6 sc

Rnd. 2: ch1; *2sc in next sc*; repeat from *to* 5 times. 12 sc

Rnd. 3: ch1, sc in each sc; join with slst to beginning sc. 12 sc

Rnd. 4: *ch3, slst in next sc*; repeat from *to* around, join with slst; fasten off.

Assembly:

Tightly roll flower, whip stitch in place at bottom as you roll. Place stem at bottom of flower and tack in place

Skill Level: Easy

Supplies: Size 10 cotton crochet thread, B/1/2.25mm crochet hook, (or size 3 steel crochet hook for smaller size flower)

This pattern can also be completed using size 20 cotton crochet thread using a size 6 or size 10 steel crochet hook.

Stitches Used: slst (slip stitch), ch (chain), sc (single crochet), dc (double crochet), tr (treble), dtr (double treble).

Gauge will vary depending on size of hook and thread.

Directions:

Rnd. 1: ch3, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across; ch3, turn. 30 sc

Rnd. 2: dc in same st; *2dc in next sc*; repeat from *to* across; ch3, turn. 60 dc

Rnd. 3: ch3, dc in same st; 2dc in next 19 sc; 2tr in next 20 dc; 2dtr in next 20 dc; ch3, turn.

Rnd. 4: dc in same st; skip next 2 dc; *sc, ch2, dc in next st; skip next 2 st*; repeat from *to* across; fasten off.

Stem:

Rnd. 1: ch2, 6sc in 2nd ch from hook, join with slst to beginning sc. 6 sc

Rnd. 2: ch1; *2sc in next sc*; repeat from *to* 5 times. 12 sc

Rnd. 3: ch1, sc in each sc; join with slst to beginning sc. 12 sc

Rnd. 4: repeat rnd. 3. 12 sc

Rnd. 5: *ch3, slst in next sc*; repeat from *to* around, join with slst; fasten off.

Assembly:

Tightly roll flower, whip stitch in place at bottom as you roll. Place stem at bottom of flower and tack in place.
