

Mountain laurel Crochet Flower Bud Pattern



Crochet Yarn

- Crochet cotton Size 5 colour A = white
- embroidery cotton colour B = pink.

Crochet Hook

- 1mm steel hook, 1.75 mm steel hook.

Details of components

- ball-shaped white flower with ridges.

Crochet Flower Bud Pattern

Elongated Ball:



Start: using 1.75mm hook and colour A make 3ch, join in ring with sl st, 1ch

R1: make 5sc, join in ring with sl st, 1ch

R2: make 2sc in each st = 10sc, join in ring with sl st, 1ch

R3: (2sc in next st, 1sc in next st) x 5 = 15sc, join in ring with sl st, 1ch



R4: (2sc in next st, 1sc in next 2 sts) x 5 = 20sc, join in ring with sl st, 1ch

R5: 20sc, join in ring with sl st, 1ch

R6: same



R7: same

R8: (make 2sc, skip next sc, make 1sc) x 5 = 15sc, join in ring with sl st, 1ch

R9: 15sc, join in ring with sl st, 1ch

R10: (make 1sc, skip next st, make 1sc) x 5 = 10sc, join in ring with sl st, change to colour B, fasten off A

R11: (make 1sc, skip next st) x 5 = 5sc. Fasten off B.



Ridges:



Mark 10 lines onto the base of the ball.

Using 1mm hook and colour A, start picking up sts from the surface of the ball going up on the marked lines towards the top: make 2sc, 1hdc, 1dc, 1hdc, 4sc, fasten off = 1 ridge. Make 10 ridges.



Mountain laurel Crochet Flower Pattern



Crochet Yarn

- Crochet cotton Size 10 colour A = white
- Embroidery cotton colour B = pink.

Crochet Hook

- 1mm steel hook, 1.75 mm steel hook.

Details of components

- white umbrella-shaped flower with outer ridges and a pink detail in the centre
- white stamens with pink polen.

Crochet Flower Pattern

Start: using colour A and 1.75mm hook, make 4ch, join with sl st, 1ch,

R1: make 5sc, join with sl st, 1ch,

R2: same

R3: make 2sc in each st = 10sc, join with sl st, change to colour B



R4: (make 2sc in next sc, 1dc) x 5 = 15sc, change to colour A, fasten off B

R5: 2sc in each sc from R4, 1dc in each of the dc from R4 = 25sts, join with sl st, 1ch,

R6: 2sc in each sc on both sides of the dc, 1sc in the rest of the sc from R5, 1dc in each of the dc from R5 = 35sts, join with sl st, 1ch,

R7: (1dc, 1hdc, 2sc, 1hdc, 1dc) between the dcs from R6, 1tr in the dcs from R6

R8: (2dc in the dc from R7, 1hdc, 2sc, 1hdc, 2dc in the dc from R7) between the trs from R7, 1tr in each tr from R7, join with sl st, 1ch

R9: make hdc in the sc, hdc in the hdc, dc in the dc, tr in the tr from previous row, join with sl st, 1ch

R10: (2dc, 4hdc, 2dc) between the trs, 1tr in each tr from R9, join with sl st, 1ch

R11: make sc in each hdc and dc from R10 = 10sc, make (1dc, 1tr, 1dc) in each tr from R10, fasten off.



Ridges:

Using 1mm hook and colour A, pick up sts from the outer surface of the corolla starting from the colour B row and moving towards the edge of the petals. Make 10 ridges: 5 running in the middle of the 5 petals and 5 running between each two petals.

Ridges in the middle of the petals:



Start : make 3sc, 2hdc, 2dc, 1tr, 1dc, 1hdc, 3sc, 1 sl st finishing about 1cm from the edge pf petal, fasten off = 1 ridge.

Ridges between the petals:

Start : make 3sc, 2hdc, 2dc, 1tr, 1dc, 1sc, 1 sl st finishing at the edge pf petal, fasten off = 1 ridge.



Stamens and Stigma



Using colour A and 1mm hook, make 15ch, skip 1st ch, make 14sl st = 1 stamen. Make 5 stamens. Continue with stigma: 15ch, 1 small Clones Knot, make 14sl st : Fasten off. Roll the stamens keeping the stigma in the middle, pull them through the flower centre and sew at the back.

Thread a needle with colour B (3strands) and secure the end of each stamen to the middle of each petal using a French knot. Use a purple/pink colour marker to colour the Clones Knot on the stigma.



Crochet Mountain laurel

Blue Violet Crochet Flower Pattern



Crochet Yarn

- Embroidery cotton colour A = blue, colour B = yellow, colour D = dark blue
- Crochet cotton Size 10 colour C = white.

Crochet Hook

- 1.75 mm steel hook.

Details of components

- 5 blue petals flower, 2×2 fan-shaped petals mirrored and a lower petal with darker veins.

Crochet Flower Pattern

Start: using colour B, make 3ch, join with sl st, 1ch,

R1: 5sc, join with sl st, 1ch,

R2: same



R3: make 2ch in each of next 2sts, 1sc in the next 3sts, join with sl st, 1ch,

Large Petals

R1: 3sc, 1ch, turn

R2: 2sc, 2sts-sc inc, change to colour C, 1ch, turn

R3: 2sc in next sc, 1dc, 1tr, 2sc in the last sc, change to colour A, 2ch, turn

R4: 1tr, 1dtr, 2tr cluster, 1tr, 3ch, sl st in the last st from R3 = 1petal

Make a second petal in next st.

Using colour B make 3sc in next sc, 1 sl st in next sc, 3sc in next sc, change to colour C, turn and continue with the small petals.



Small Petals

R1: use colour C and make 2sc in next st, 1dc in next 2sts, change to colour A, 2ch, turn

R2: 1tr, 2tr cluster, 3ch, sl st in the last st from R1. Fasten off all yarns.

Working on the WS, tie colour C and make 2dc in the next sc, 2sc, change to colour A, 3ch, turn

R3: 2tr cluster, 1tr, 2ch, sl st in the last st. Fasten off all yarns.

Lower Petal



Working on the RS tie in colour A in the sl st between the small petals, make 2sc in the sl st, 1ch, turn

R1: make 2sc in each sc, change to colour A, 2ch, turn

R2: 4dc, 2ch, turn

R3: 2dc in next dc, 2dc, 2dc in next dc, 1ch, turn

R4: 3sts-sc dec, 1 picot, 3sts-sc dec.

Assembly



Thread a needle with colour B and sew the large petals to help them stay close to each other.

Thread a needle with colour D and sew back stitch from the centre of the flower to half way on the lower petal and a couple of concentric circles in the centre of the flower.

Crochet Blue Violet

This is it! The crochet flower pattern is ready!



Philadelphia Lily Crochet Flower Pattern



Crochet Yarn

- Crochet cotton Size 5 colour A = orange
- Embroidery cotton colour B = yellow, colour C = purple, colour D = green.

Crochet Hook

- 1mm steel hook, 1.75 mm steel hook.

Details of components

- lily-shaped flower with 6 orange tepals narrowing towards the base
- orange stamens.

Crochet Flower Pattern

Crochet Stem



Start: using colour D and 1.75mm hook, make 4ch, join with sl st, 1ch,

R1: 5sc, join with sl st, 1ch; continue working in spiral for a few inches just enough to cover a toothpick, or as long as you'd like the stem to be. Increase to 6sc in the last row. Make a tepal in each of the 6sts from the last row.

Crochet Tepals (6 pcs.)



Start: tie in colour C, * make 6ch, skip 1st ch, make 3sc, 2hdc, sl st in next sc and repeat from * 5 more times; these will be the ends of the tepals connecting with the base.



R1: on WS, tie in colour A in the sl st on tip of the tepal's stem make 15ch, skip 1st ch, 1sl st, 2sc, 2hdc, 6dc, 3tr, 2ch, 1sl st in the st where we tied in yarn, 2ch, turn and work on the other side of the 15ch

R2: 2tr, 6dc, 2hdc, 2sc, 1sl st, fasten off.



Stamens (3pcs.)



Start: Using colour A and 1mm hook, make 12ch, make a small Clones Knot and return with 11sl st = 1 stamen. Make 3 pcs.

Assembly

Roll the stamens and pull them through the centre of the flower. Sew them in.

Thread a needle with colour C and sew in a tube the little stem of each tepal. Sew dots onto the tepals in the same yarn.



Crochet Philadelphia Lily

This is it! The crochet flower pattern is ready!



Orange Gerbera Daisy Crochet Flower Pattern



Crochet Yarn

- Crochet cotton Size 5 colour A = orange-multi
- Embroidery cotton colour B = green.

Crochet Hook

- 1.75 mm steel hook.

Details of components

- daisy type of flower head with orange ray florets and green disc florets in the centre
- green receptacle at the calyx.

Crochet Flower Pattern

Crochet Disc Florets (Flower Head centre)



Start: using colour B and 1.75mm hook, make 2ch, skip 1st ch and make 5sc in next, join with sl st, 1ch and continue working in round

R1: make 2sc in each sc = 10sts, join with sl st, 1ch

R2: (make 2sc in next sc, 1sc in next sc) x 5 = 15sts, join with sl st. Fasten off.

Crochet Ray Florets

We're going to make a continuous strip of 3 different types of ray florets using colour A and hook 1.75mm, then assemble them around the disc florets centre.

Ray Floret style 1: make 4ch, skip 1st ch, 3sl st. Make 30.



Ray Florets style 2: make 6ch, skip 1st ch, 1sl st, 4sc. Make 12.

Ray Florets style 3: make 10ch, skip 1st ch, 1sl st, 1sc, 7hdc. Make 12.

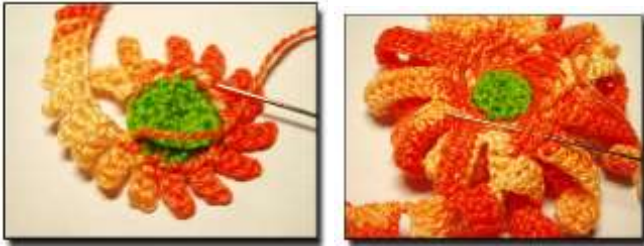
Ray Florets style 4: make 13ch, skip 1st ch, 1sl st, 1sc, 10hdc. Make 12.

Ray Florets style 5: make 16ch, skip 1st ch, 1sl st, 1sc, 1hdc, 12dc. Make 10. Fasten off.



Assembly

Thread a needle with colour A, turn the disc to WS and the ray florets to WS and start rolling and sewing the rays to the disc, increasing the diameter of the circle with each additional row of florets. Give the outer florets a light steam.



Crochet Orange Gerbera

This is it! The crochet flower pattern is ready!



Persian Cyclamen Crochet Flower Pattern



Crochet Yarn

- Embroidery cotton colour A = burgundy, colour B = scarlet, colour C = green.

Crochet Hook

- 1mm steel hook, 1.75 mm steel hook.

Details of components

- flower with 5 upswept scarlet petals with a burgundy band at the base
- calyx with 5 green sepals.

Crochet Flower Pattern

Crochet Stem



Start: using colour A and 1mm hook, make 2ch, skip 1st ch and make 3sc in next, join with sl st, and continue working in spiral around a toothpick for a few inches until it's covered. Make 5sc in the last row. Change to colour C.

Crochet Calyx



R1: make 5sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R2: make 2sc in each sc = 10sts, join with sl st, 1ch

R3: 10sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R4: (1sc in next sc, 1dc in next sc) x 5, join with sl st. Fasten off.

Crochet Corolla



Start: Using colour A and 1mm hook, make 2ch, skip 1st ch and make 5sc in next, join with sl st, 1ch

R1: 5sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R2: make 2sc in each sc = 10sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R3: 10sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R4: (2sc in next sc, 1sc in next 4sc) x 2 = 12sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R5: 12sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R6: (2sc in next sc, sc in next 3sc) x 3 = 15sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R7: 15sc, join with sl st, change to colour B, turn

R8: using 1.75mm hook, make 14ch, turn, skip 1st ch, make 13sc, 1sl st in the sc in the ring, 1ch, turn

R9: (in the next 2sc make sl st, 2sc, 2hdc, 3dc, 2hdc, 2sc, (1sc, 1 picot, 1sc) in the top st, 2sc, 2hdc, 3dc, 2hdc, 3sc, 1sl st in the next sc in the ring) x 5 = 5 petals, fasten off.



Assembly



Tuck the end of the corolla inside of the calyx.

Roll the petals upwards.

Cut 2 pieces of yarn colour A 3 inches long, twist and make a know at one end and pull the other end through the centre of the flower = stigma.

Crochet Persian Cyclamen

Crochet Yarn

- Embroidery cotton colour A = orange/peach, colour C = orange, colour D = green
- Crochet cotton Size 10, colour B = white.

Crochet Hook

- 1mm steel hook, 1.75 mm steel hook.

Details of components

- trumpet-shaped flower with 5 petals fused at base and developing into 3 small fringed lower petals and a large 2-lobed petal at top.

Crochet Flower Pattern

Crochet Stem and leaf



Start: using D and 1.75mm hook, make 12ch, skip 1st ch, make sl st in next 11ch = 11sts.

Make 15ch, skip 2ch, make 1sc, 1hdc, 4dc, 5tr, 1dc, 1sc, join with sl st at end of stem. Fasten off.

Crochet Corolla

Start: using A and 1.75mm hook, make 4ch, join with sl st, 1ch,

R1: make 6sc in the ring, join with sl st, 1ch,



R2: (2sc in next sc, 1sc in the next 2sc) x 2 = 8sts, join with sl st, 1ch,

R3: 8sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R4: same; R5: same

R6: (2sc in next sc, 1sc in the next 3sc) x 2 = 10sts, join with sl st, 1ch,

R7: 10sc, join with sl st, 1ch



R8: (2sc in next sc, 1sc in the next 4sc) x 2 = 12sts, join with sl st, 1ch,

R9: 12sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R10: (2sc in next sc, 1sc in the next 2sc) x 4 = 16sts, join with sl st, 1ch,

R11: 16sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R12: **top petal:** 1sc, 7ch, skip 1st, make 6hdc, 1sl st in next sc in the ring, 1ch, turn

R13: 1sl st, 1sc, 2hdc, 5ch, turn

R14: skip 1st ch, make 1hdc, 5dc, 2hdc, 1sl st in next sc in the ring, 1ch, turn

R15: make 2sc, 6ch, turn

R16: skip 1st ch, make 1hdc, 5dc, 2sc, 1sl st in next sc in the ring, 1ch, turn

R17: 1sl st, 1sc, 2hdc, 3ch, turn

R18: skip 1st, make 6hdc, 1sl st in next sc in the ring = **top petal finished.**

R19: **lower petal:** 1sc in next sc, 7ch, skip 1st, make 6hdc, 1sl st in 2nd next sc in the ring, 1ch, turn

R20: 3hdc, 4ch, turn

R21: 6hdc, sl st in next sc in the ring. Repeat twice from R19 to make 2 more lower petals. Fasten off.



Inner side of corolla

Start: using 1mm hook and colour B, (make 4ch, skip 1st 3ch and make dc in the 4th) x 4, 1ch, turn

R1: work in the 4 spaces created between the dc and the 3ch:

Inner petal 1 (1sc, 1hdc, 1dc, 1hdc, 1sc),

Inner petal 2 (1sc, 1hdc, 1dc, 3tr, 1hdc, 1sc), , ,

Inner petal 3 (1sc, 1hdc, 1dc, 1hdc, 1sc)

Inner petal 4 [(1sc, 6ch, skip 1st ch, make 1sc, 4hdc) x 2, sl st]. Join with sl st in the first inner petal.

Assembly



Push the inner petals inside the trumpet's mouth, so that inner petal 1 goes over the right hand side lower petal... inner petal 4 goes over middle lower petal and sew to the corolla. Thread a needle with colour C and sew a few dots on top of the middle inner petal.



Crochet Sticky Monkey Flower

This is it! The crochet flower pattern is ready!



Blue Vanda Orchid Crochet Flower Pattern



Crochet Yarn

- Crochet cotton Size 5, colour A = deep blue multi, colour B = white
- Embroidery cotton colour C = yellow, colour D = purple.

Crochet Hook

- 1mm steel hook, 1.75 mm steel hook.

Details of components

- flat flower with 3 deep blue sepals, 2 petals, a lip and a short spur.

Crochet Flower Pattern

Crochet Sepals (3pcs.)



Start: using colour A and 1.75mm hook, make 5ch, join with sl st, 1ch,

R1: (1sc in ring, 2ch) x 3, join with sl st in 1stsc, 1ch,

R2: work each sepal in the 2ch loop from previous row: (1sc, 5ch, 3sts-trtr cluster, 1picot, 3sts-trtr cluster, 5ch, 1sc) x 3 = 3 sepals. Fasten off A.

Crochet Column, Petals and Lip



Start: using colour C and 1mm hook, make 2ch, skip 1st ch, make 4sc in the next ch, join with sl st, change to colour B, 1ch

R1: make 4sc, join with sl st, change to colour A, 1ch

R2: 4sc, join with sl st, change to 1.75mm hook

R3: (1sc in next sc, 2ch,) x 2, 1sc in next sc, 4ch, join with sl st in 1st ch, 1ch,

R4: work each petal in the 2ch loop from previous row: (1sc, 5ch, 2sts-trtr cluster, 2sts-trtr cluster, 5ch, 1sc) x 2;



- Work the spur and lip in the 4ch loop from previous row:

R1: change to colour D, make 4sc in the 4ch loop, and pick 3sc from the ring's side, join with sl st, 1ch

R2: 7sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R3: skip 1st sc, make 6sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R4: skip 1st sc, 5sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R5: skip 1st sc, 4sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R6: (skip 1st sc, 1sc) x 2. Fasten off.

- Tie in colour D at right hand side of the spur, make 5ch, skip 1st ch, make 4sc, 1ch, turn



R1: in the flo, work 4sc, 1ch, turn

R2: in the blo, 4sc, join with sl st at left hand side of spur. Fasten off.

Assembly



Position the petals & lip over and between the sepals and sew together. The spur should point towards the back of the flower.

Crochet Vanda Orchid flower

This is it! The crochet flower pattern is ready!



Rocky Mountains Zinnia Crochet Flower Pattern



Crochet Yarn

- Embroidery cotton colour A = yellow, colour B = orange.

Crochet Hook

- 1mm steel hook, 1.75 mm steel hook.

Details of components

- 3-6 bright yellow ray florets and a cluster of darker tubular disc florets at the centre.

Crochet Flower Pattern

Crochet Ray Florets

Start: using colour A and 1.75mm hook make 6ch, join with sl st, 1ch

R1: 10sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R2: (1sc, 6ch, 5sts-trtr cluster, 6ch, 1sc in the next sc) x 5, join with sl st. Fasten off.



Crochet Disc Florets (3pcs.)



Start: using colour A and 1mm hook make 2ch, skip 1st ch, make 2sc in the next ch, join with sl st.

Work in spiral 6sc, change to colour B, 1ch

R1: make 2sc in each sc = 4sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R2: 4sc, join with sl st, 1ch

R4: (skip 1sc, 1sc) x 2, fasten off. Make 3 florets.

Assembly



Pull the 3 disc florets through the flower centre and sew at the back.

Cut 8-10 pcs. of colour A, 2 inches long. We'll place these pieces around the disc florets: pull each piece half way and tie a knot. Trim them shorter than the florets.

Crochet Zinnia grandiflora

This is it! The crochet flower pattern is ready!



Crochet Pattern: Rose

Row 1: with pink, ch 51, (dc, ch 2, dc) in fifth ch from hook, (ch 2, skip 2 ch, [dc, ch 2, dc] in next ch) across until 1 ch remains, dc in last ch

Row 2: ch 3, turn, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in first ch-2 space, *skip next ch-2 space, (ch 2, 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch-2 space, repeat from * across until 1 dc remains, dc in last dc

Row 3: turn, *9 dc in next ch-2 space, (sl st, ch 1, sl st, ch 1) in next ch-2 space, repeat from * across, finish off.

Using photo as a guide, roll rose together and sew with yarn needle.

Leaf (Make 2)

Row 1: with green, ch 14, sl st in second ch from hook, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, dc in next 2 ch, tr in next 2 ch, dc in next 2 ch, hdc in next 2 ch, sc in next ch, sl st in next ch

Row 2: ch 1, turn, sl st in next sl st, sc in next sc, hdc in next hdc, dc in next 2 dc, tr in next 2 tr, dc in next 2 dc, hdc in next 2 hdc, sc in next sc, sl st in next sl st, finish off.

With yarn needle, sew leaves to rose using photo as a guide.

Finished Measurements

Flowers range from 10½ tall to 19½ tall (Heights are adjustable depending on the length of stems)

Materials

1 Hank each [Berroco Pure Pima](#) (50 grs), #2238 Cantaloupe (A), #2255 Baton Rouge (B), #2236 Nectar (C), #2227 Sprout (D) and #2240 Kelp (E)

Crochet hook, size 3.75 mm (F-5)

2 Yds Green electrical wire (1.5 mm)

Invisible nylon thread

Sewing needle

Tapestry needle

Green Floral tape

Craft glue

Rust-proof pins for blocking

¾ Yd 1½ wide Satin ribbon

Gauge

There are no gauge requirements for this project

Stitch Glossary

Dc2tog

* Yo, insert hook in next st, yo, draw up a loop, yo, draw through 2 loops on hook, rep from * once more; yo, draw through remaining 3 loops on hook – 1 st dec'd

Lily (Make 4)

With crochet hook, using A, ch 4, join with a sl st to form a ring.

Base: Rnd 1: Work 5 sc's in ring, join with a sl st in beg sc.

Rnds 2 and 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join with a sl st in beg sc.

Petal Veins: Rnd 4: * Ch 25, turn. Beg in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in the back loop of each ch back to base **; sl st in next st of base *; rep between *'s 4 times more, then rep from * to ** once more – 6 veins.

Petals: Rnd 5: This rnd will be up one side of each petal vein and down the other. Working into the back loop of each st, * sl st in first 6 sts, sc in next 4 sts, hdc in next st, dc in next 8 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, sc in next st, sl st in last 2 sts; turn and working on opposite side of vein, sl st in 1st st, sc in next st, hdc in next 3 sts, dc in next 8 sts, hdc in next

st, sc in next 4 sts, sl st in last 6 sts; sl st between veins *; rep between *'s 5 times more. Fasten off. Weave in all ends with tapestry needle. Mold each lily into shape and pin with rust-proof pins on a blocking or ironing board, spray with water and allow to dry. Using invisible thread and sewing needle, sew petals together from base to widest part of each petal.

Lily Center (Make 4)

Filaments: Base: With crochet hook, using C, ch 6, sl st in 2nd ch to form a ring (the protruding 1st ch will be the st you insert your hook into to begin the pistil).

Rnd 1: Work 5 sc's in ring, join with a sl st in 1st sc.

Rnd 2: * Ch 12, then beg in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in the back loop of each ch back to base, sl st in next st *; rep between *'s 5 times more. Fasten off.

Anthers: Work with top side of filaments facing up. Using B, insert crochet hook into the end of a filament. (Ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook) twice, bring yarn under filament, sl st back into end of filament. Fasten off. Repeat in each of the remaining 5 filaments.

Pistil: Using D, insert hook in center of filaments through protruding 1st ch. Ch 15; dc in 2nd ch from hook, then sl st in the back loop of each ch back to base. Sl st back into 1st ch of filament. Fasten off. Weave in all ends.

Lily Buds

Small Buds (Make 2): Using crochet hook and D, ch 3, join with a sl st in 1st ch to form a ring.

Veins: Rnd 1: * Ch 25; beg in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each ch back to base. Sl st into ring *. Rep between *'s twice more – 3 veins.

Petals: Rnd 2: Working along vein, ** sl st in 1st 6 sts, sc in next st, hdc in next 12 sts, sc in next 3 sts, sl st in last 3 sts; turn and working on opposite side of vein, sl st in first 2 sts, sc in next 3 sts, hdc in next 12 sts, sc in next st, sl st in last 6 sts, sl st between petals **; rep between **'s along remaining veins – 3 petals. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Large Buds (Make 2): Using crochet hook and A, ch 3, join with a sl st to form a ring.

Veins: Rnd 1: * Ch 30. Beg in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each st back to base, sl st into ring *; rep between *'s twice more – 3 veins.

Petals: Rnd 2: Working along veins, ** sl st in 1st 6 sts, sc in next st, hdc in next st, dc in next 15 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in next 2 sts, sl st in last 3 sts; turn and working on opposite side of vein, sl st in first 2 sts, sc in next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, dc in next 15 sts, hdc in next st, sc in next sc, sl st in last 6 sts, sl st between petals **; rep between **'s on remaining veins – 3 petals. Fasten off and weave in ends. Block all buds same as lilies. When dry, using invisible thread and sewing needle, sew 2 petals of each bud together from base to top. On the third petal of each bud, sew one edge to the next petal from base to top. Leave the lower 1/2" of the last side open to insert stem later.

Wildflower (Make 3)

Large Center: With crochet hook, using D, ch 4; work 8 dc's in 1st ch, join with a sl st in top of beg ch-4.

Rnd 2: Ch 2, hdc in same st, * hdc in next st, 2 hdc's in next st *; rep between *'s 3 times more, hdc in last st; join with a sl st in top of beg ch-2.

Rnd 3: * Ch 3, skip next 2 ch's, sl st in back loop of next st *; rep between *'s 4 times more. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Petals: (Each petal is worked back and forth in the ch-3 loops of previous rnd).

Row 1: With RS facing, using crochet hook, join B with a sl st in any ch-3 loop of Rnd 3. Ch 2, 4 hdc. Turn.

Row 2: Ch 2, (2 hdc in next st, hdc in next st) twice, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in 1st st, dc in next 3 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in last st, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3, dc2tog over next 2 sts, dc in next st, sl st in next st, dc in next st, dc2tog over next 2 sts, dc in last st. Fasten off and weave in ends. Repeat these 4 rows over each ch-3 space of Rnd 3 – 5 petals.

Edging: With RS facing, using crochet hook and B, work in hdc around the outside edge of each petal, working a sl st in center st at top of each petal and between each petal. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Small Center: With crochet hook and E, ch 3, 5 hdc in 1st ch from hook, join with a sl st in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off and weave in ends. With tapestry needle and C, embroider lines on large center of flower by inserting the needle up in the center, then back down in each of the hdc's in the circle. Using invisible thread and sewing needle, sew small center in middle of large center on each flower. Cut thirty 3 1/4" long pieces of C (10 for each flower). With back of flower facing you, insert hook in loop just below one of the 2 edge sts of large center, wrap one 3 1/4" strand of yarn around hook and pull through work; then wrap 2 ends of strand around hook and pull through as if making fringe. In this manner, attach two 3 1/4" strands behind each petal. Pull ends of strands through to front of flower, trim ends, then untwist fibers. Block wildflowers same as lilies.

Wildflower Base: With crochet hook, using D, ch 4, join with a sl st to form a ring.

Rnd 1: Ch 2, 5 hdc in ring, join with a sl st in top of beg ch-2.

Rnds 2 and 3: Ch 2, hdc in same st and in each st around, join with a sl st in top of beg ch-2.

Rnd 4: Ch 2, hdc in same st, 2 hdc in next st, (hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st *; rep between *'s 3 times more, hdc in last st, join with a sl st in top of beg ch-2. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Leaves

Small Lily Leaves (Make 6): Using crochet hook and E, ch 18; beg in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in back loop of each ch to last st. Change to D and sl st in last st. Turn. Sc in first 2 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, dc in next 8 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in next st, (sc, ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc) in last st; turn, working on opposite side, sc in 1st st, hdc in next 2 sts, dc in next 8 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, sc in last 2 sts. Join with a sl st in 1st. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Large Lily Leaves (Make 5): Using crochet hook and E, ch 22; beg in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in back loop of each ch to end. Turn work, sc in 1st 2 sts, hdc in next 5 sts, dc in next 9 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, sc in next 2 sts, (sc, ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook sc) in last st; turn, working on opposite side, sc in 1st 2 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, dc in next 9 sts, hdc in next 5 sts, sc in last 2 sts, join with a sl st in first st. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Small Wildflower Leaves (Make 6): Using crochet hook and E, ch 17. Beg in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in back loop of each ch to end. Turn work, sc in 1st 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, dc in next 2 sts, tr in next st, 2 tr in next st, tr in next st, dc in next 3 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in next 2 sts, (sc, ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc) in last st; turn, working on opposite side, sc in 1st 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, tr in next st, 2 tr in next st, tr in next st, dc in next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in last 2 sts, join with a sl st in first st. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Large Wildflower Leaves (Make 2): Using crochet hook and E, ch 22. Beg in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in back loop of each ch to end. Turn work, sc in 1st 2 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, dc in next 3 sts, tr in next 2 sts, 2 tr in next st, tr in next 2 sts, dc in next 4 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in next 2 sts, (sc, ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc) in last st; turn, working on opposite side, sc in 1st 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, dc in next 4 sts, tr in next 2 sts, 2 tr in next st, tr in next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, sc in last 2 sts, join with a sl st in first st. Fasten off and weave in ends. Block all leaves same as lilies.

Stems

Cut Electrical Wire in the following lengths:

For Lilies: Cut 2 pieces 10 1/2" long and 1 piece each 11" and 15" long

For Lily Buds: Cut 1 piece each 16 1/2" and 18 1/2" long

For Lily Bud Branches: Cut 2 pieces each 3 1/2" long

For Wildflowers: Cut 1 piece each 13 1/2", 15" and 19 1/2" long

For Lily and Wildflower stems, using E, make a slip knot and tie to end of a stem. Tightly wrap yarn around stem to the other end. Cut yarn and pull end back under last wrap to secure. Put a dab of glue on each end so that yarn won't slip off.

Wrap shorter Lily Bud branches same as lily and wildflower stems. Wrap longer Lily Bud stems in the same manner to 3 1/2" down from top. Then, holding shorter branch against stem, wrap the 2 pieces together for about 1/2". Wrap yarn in a figure 8 around both pieces several times, then continue to wrap stem to end. Finish same as lily and wildflower stems.

Finishing

Lilies: Insert a lily stem into the hole in the lily base. Wrap the last ½” of the stem several times with floral tape so that the stem cannot slip out of the flower. With invisible thread and sewing needle, sew filaments to the center of the flower, enclosing the end of the flower stem.

Lily Buds: Insert lily bud stems and branches into holes in lily bud bases and wrap with tape same as for lilies. Sew the last ½” of petals closed around stems.

Wildflowers: Insert wildflower stems into the hole in bottom of wildflower bases. Wrap floral tape around ends of stems so that it covers the length of the bases and won't slip out. With invisible thread and sewing needle, sew bases to bottom sides of the large centers of flowers enclosing stems.

Adding Leaves: Using invisible thread and sewing needle, sew leaves to each stem as follows:

2 Shortest Lilies: Attach 1 small lily leaf at base of flower.

Middle Lily: Attach 2 small lily leaves at base and 1 large leaf 3½” below base.

Tallest Lily: Attach 1 small lily leaf at base and 2 large leaves 2¾” below base.

Shorter Lily Bud: Attach 1 large lily leaf at junction of the stem and branch.

Taller Lily Bud: Attach 1 small lily leaf at base of small bud and 1 large leaf at junction of stem and branch.

Shortest Wildflower: Attach 2 small wildflower leaves 2¾” below base.

Middle Wildflower: Attach 2 small wildflower leaves 2¾” below base.

Tallest Wildflower: Attach 2 small wildflower leaves 3” below base and 2 large wildflower leaves 6” below base. Gather all flowers together in a “bouquet” and tie stems together with ribbon as in photo.

Easter Lily!



This pattern is easy to intermediate, and takes just a few hours to complete. The finished flower is approximately 7 ½ inches wide.

- US F hook, 3.75mm
- Worsted weight yarn in white, green, and yellow

Make the Stamens:



First Stamen: With light green yarn, ch10. Switching to yellow yarn, continue with 5 more chains. Sl st in fourth hump from hook (the back of the first yellow ch). Switching back to green, sl st into the next green hump and on down the rest of the stamen to the end, moving the yellow yarn ends back and forth with each stitch, to either side of the working yarn, so that they are trapped under the stitches. Cut the yellow yarn, but not the green.

Second Stamen: Continue with green yarn. Ch 12. Continue as for first stamen.

Third Stamen: Continue with green yarn. Ch 10. Continue as for first stamen. Sl st to bottom of first stamen. Cut the yellow yarn and the green yarn and finish off. Do not weave in ends. Set aside.

Make the Petals: (Make 6)



Using the white yarn, ch 15.

Row 1 (WS): Working into the back of the ch, sl st in second hump from hook. Sc in next 2 ch. Hdc in 3 ch. Dc in last 8 ch. Turn.

Row 2 (RS): Working in blo for this entire row, ch2 and dc in first 8 sts. Hdc in 3 sts, sc in 2 sts, join to last st with a sl st. Break yarn and finish off. Weave in this tip end only. Do not weave in the yarn end at the base of the petal.

Make the Trumpet, adding the Stamens:



Joining Row: Using the white yarn, join yarn with sl st to WS of base end of first petal. Ch1 and sc 5 sts evenly across. Pick up second petal, and working into the wrong side of the end of this petal, continue with 5 more sc across. Continue in this manner until all 6 petals are joined. Sl st in first sc to create circle. (30 sc) Use the remaining yarn ends from the base ends of the petals to attach each petal to the one next to it with one stitch, and then weave in these ends.

Row 1: Ch1 and work evenly around. Do not join with sl st. (From here the Trumpet is worked in spirals.) (30sc)

Row 2: Working directly into top of first st of last row, [sc in 3 sts, sc2tog] 6 times. (24sc)

Row 3: Sc evenly to end of row. (24sc)

Row 4: [Sc in 2 sts, sc2tog] 6 times. (18 sc)

Row 5: Sc evenly to end of row (18sc)

Row 6: [Sc in 1 st, sc2tog] 6 times. (12 sc)

Row 7: Sc evenly to end of row (12sc) Now insert the stamen into the flower, so that the yellow crocheted ends are pointing towards the petals and the loose ends are sticking out the end you are working from. Hold these in place as you continue to work the flower Trumpet.

Row 8: Sc2tog around to end. (6 sc)

Row 9-11: Sc evenly around to end (6sc) Break yarn, finish off. Knot the white end and several of the stamen ends together so that stamens are held securely. Trim all these ends together to about ¼ inch.

Make the Trumpet Cap:



Leaving a long tail and using the magic circle, ch1 and sc 6 times in the circle. Pull the circle tight and move the tail to the front of the work, so that it points towards you from the middle of the circle. Join with sl st in first sc.

Row 1: Ch1 and sc evenly around, join with sl st in first sc. (6sc)

Row 2: Ch1, then [sc in st, then 2sc in next st] 3 times. Join with sl st. (9sc)

Row 3: Ch1 and sc evenly around, join with sl st. (9sc)

Break yarn, and finish off, leaving long tail to sew to flower. Firmly push the end of the flower into the Cap, making sure all the stamen ends are tucked in and not visible.

Sew the Cap to the flower, then weave in and trim end. Flip the flower over and arrange petals to curve outward. Use the remaining long end to sew your new Lily to your favorite summer hat or to add it to your handmade springtime bouquet!
